The new IRAC website, publicised at the end of last year, officially went live during January 2004. Using the latest web technologies and techniques, information about IRAC and

Features of the new IRAC website

Information is organised into five easy-to-use drop down menus. Further a Search Function and Site Map are provided for quick location of documents, and the breadcrumb below the menus provides a sense of presence within the site. Quicklinks, based on the most regularly used pages are stored in the utility column on the right. Password protected Members Areas have been included for Team & Group information. See the site »

Search Engine Optimisation (SEO) and Site Ranking Each page on the site is being individually optimised for different sets of relevant keywords and different search engines. The aim is to achieve high rankings in multiple search engines for popular search phrases - around 80% of site visitors arrive through the engines. Google accounts for over half of this 80% in the UK, US and others, and we are now quickly climbing up the rankings.
